Update on Declaration of Local State of Emergency for Area 'C' Evacuation Orders Old Remo, New Remo, and Usk

Due to the continued localized flooding that is impacting access and egress coupled with the potential for high-level snow melt and forecasted precipitation (see the Clever Model forecast here: http://bcrfc.env.gov.bc.ca/freshet/map_clever.html), the RDKS is maintaining a Declaration of Local State of Emergency Order for Area 'C' and Evacuation Orders for Old Remo, New Remo, and Usk that commenced at 8 p.m., June 5, 2022.

Interruption of Service for the Usk Ferry & Cable/Arial Car

The **Usk Ferry and the Cable/Arial car** are no longer operational. In the event of an emergency, any remaining residents are asked to call 911 for assistance.

An Evacuation Alert remains for Dutch Valley and the RDKS continues to monitor this area.

For those residents under Evacuation Order:

Register from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. with Emergency Support Services (ESS) Reception Centre at the Thornhill Community Center, 3091 Century Street, or call the ESS contact number 24 hours/7 days a week and leave a message at 250-641-2443.

- If you need transportation assistance from the area call 250-641-2443.
- Shut off all gas and electrical appliances, other than refrigerators and freezers.
- Close all windows and doors.
- Close gates (latch) but do not lock.
- Gather your family and, if you have room, take a neighbour or someone needing transportation.
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, and keys) only if they are immediately available. Take pets in pet kennels or on leash.
- Do not use the landline telephones unless you need emergency service.

There is room at the Thornhill Agricultural Fairgrounds at 3160 #2 Highway 16 East for RV's and large animals upon request through ESS at 250-641-2443.

Sandbags and sand are available to RDKS and City of Terrace residents, at the following locations:

- Thornhill Volunteer Fire Department, 3128 Hwy 16 East. 8:30 am-4:30 pm weekdays. After hours
 and weekends call number provided on gate. Volunteer Firefighters have filled 1500 sandbags for
 those needing a little more help (this location may change to address areas of need as the highwater event develops).
- City of Terrace Public Works yard, 5003 Graham Ave., 7 am–3:30 pm weekdays. On a self serve basis.
- Vacant log sort area at the northwest corner of Keith and Kenney, follow signed access off Keith
